GENERAL INFORMATION

1. The Event is being held under the current rules of the Association Official Rulebook. The nature of the Event is defined in the Skate Canada Technical Handbook, 5000 Competitive Program. The Association reserves the right to alter the overall procedures to be followed during any part of the Event, if such alteration is considered to be in the best interest of the skaters or the Association. The Technical Representative, Chief Referee, or Senior Referee present will be the agent of the Association in such an instance.

2. **CATEGORIES:** The following Categories are to be held:
 - Men and Women Pre-Juvenile U11 Competitive Singles Freeskate (Women capped at 36 entries)
 - Men and Women Pre-Juvenile U13 Competitive Singles Freeskate (Women capped at 18 entries)
 - Men and Women Juvenile U12 Competitive Singles Freeskate (Women capped at 36 entries)
 - Men and Women Juvenile U14 Competitive Singles Freeskate (Women capped at 24 entries)

 - Men and Women Pre-Novice Competitive Singles Short Program (Women capped at 60 entries)
 - Men and Women Novice Competitive Singles Short Program (Women capped at 30 entries)
 - Men and Women Junior Competitive Singles Short Program (Women capped at 12 entries)
 - Men and Women Senior Competitive Singles Short Program

 - Men and Women Pre-Novice Competitive Singles Freeskate (Women capped at 60 entries)
 - Men and Women Novice Competitive Singles Freeskate (Women capped at 30 entries)
 - Men and Women Junior Competitive Singles Freeskate (Women capped at 12 entries)
 - Men and Women Senior Competitive Singles Freeskate

 - Boys and Girls STAR 3 (Girls capped at 64 entries)
 - Boys and Girls STAR 4: U10, U13, 13 & Over (Girls capped at 24 (U10), 32 (U13) and 16 (13&O) entries)

 - Men and Women STAR 6 (formerly Senior Bronze) (Women capped at 24 entries)
 - Men and Women STAR 8 (formerly Junior Silver) (Women capped at 16 entries)
 - Men and Women STAR 10 (formerly Senior Silver) (Women capped at 16 entries)
 - Men and Women Gold STARSkate Freeskate (Women capped at 8 entries)

Note: Registration caps are in place as per above. You will be able to register to a wait list for events that are full and will be contacted to complete your registration if time allows for additional entries.

3. **ENTRY FEES:**

ENTRY FEES	
Events Offered	Fee
Pre-Novice – Senior Competitive Singles Short Program	\$125 per skater
Pre-Juvenile – Senior Competitive Singles Freeskate	\$125 per skater
STAR 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 10 and Gold Freeskate	\$115 per skater
NOTE: \$5 from every entry fee is paid to the Section to help support the programs and services the Section provides.	
STAR will be judged as per the STAR Event Management Guide. All other events will be judged using the CPC marking system.	
Skaters may enter either Competitive OR STARSkate events.	

4. **PRACTICE ICE:** There will be no practice ice.

5. **SCHEDULE OF PRACTICE TIMES AND EVENT SCHEDULE:** A schedule will be posted on the Section website (www.skateabnwtun.ca).

6. **ENTRIES:** Entrants in Events shall be:

- a) Eligible persons as defined in Skate Canada Rule Book Section 2100
- b) Be Associate members in good standing of the Association.

Restriction of Entries – If necessary entries may be limited to adhere to the Section Guidelines for hours of competition. Competition may not begin before 12pm on Friday and may not run more than 12 hours on Saturday. Competition must be completed by 5pm on Sunday.

Skaters entering multiple events do so with the understanding that there may be conflicts that cannot be resolved.

7. **CLOSING DATE OF ENTRIES:** All entries must be received no later than **12:00pm (noon) MST on Monday March 13, 2017**. Registrations will only be accepted through the online registration system at the links on page 6. All tests must be passed by the closing date of entries.

8. **LATE ENTRIES:** Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the Technical Representative at **twice the entry fee until 12:00pm (noon) MST on March 20, 2017**. No late entries will be accepted after this date.

9. **REFUND OF ENTRY FEES:** Entry fees shall be refunded only if the event is not held or if the entry is withdrawn before the date of close of entries (Skate Canada Rule 7000 – 1.5 (2)). There will be a \$10 administration fee applied to all refunds. There will be no refunds given for medical pulls after the closing date of entries, no exceptions.

10. **MUSIC REGISTRATION:** (Rule 5705)

Each skater or pair will provide: **2 CDs (1 marked “Master”)**. Copies must be turned in at registration. Information regarding the requirements and standards for music are listed in the 2016-2017 Alberta-NWT/Nunavut General Technical Package as posted on the Section’s website: www.skateabnwtun.ca. Competitors are responsible for the recovery of their own music at the completion of the event.

11. **ACCIDENTS:** The Association and Committee of the Host Club undertake no responsibility for damages or injuries suffered by the skater. As a condition of and in consideration of their entries in this event, all competitors and their parents or guardians shall be deemed to agree to assume all risks or injuries to the competitor’s person and property resulting from, or caused by, or connected with the conduct and management of the competitions. An agreement must also be deemed to release any and all claims they may have against the officials, the Association, the Host Club, and their officers. Entries shall be accepted only in accordance with these conditions.

12. **REGISTRATION:** Skaters must register at least one hour prior to the start of their scheduled category or practice. Music must be turned in at the time of first registration (**2 copies of music must be registered**). Skaters must report to the Ice Captain one hour prior to their scheduled Category. Please refer to the Alberta-NWT/Nunavut General Technical Package (<http://skateabnwnun.ca/events/technical-information/>) for further details regarding music requirements.
13. **FLIGHT SYSTEM:** If the number of competitors in a category warrants it, a flight system will be used. Refer to the 2016-2017 Alberta-NWT/Nunavut General Technical Package as posted on the Section's website: www.skateabnwnun.ca for details.
14. **EVENT SPECIFICATIONS:** In normal circumstances, each category offered at the competition will be held for men and women separately. It is permissible for events that do not progress skaters on to a subsequent level of Interclub competition to combine events as follows:
 - (a) Combine two or more categories in the same event when each category has fewer than three entries;
 - (b) Combine two or more categories in the same event when one category has insufficient entries to hold the event;
 - (c) Combine men and women in events when insufficient entries are registered in one to hold the event.The decision to combine events is at the discretion of the Technical Representative and the Host Committee. In any of the above cases, categories may be combined only with full prior knowledge of all competitors affected. If a category is not held, due to a lack of competitors, the Host Committee will inform competitors and refund entry fees.
15. **CANCELLATION OF EVENTS:** The host club reserves the right to cancel events.
16. **EVENT REGISTRATION & ELIGIBILITY:** Refer to the 2016-2017 Alberta-NWT/Nunavut General Technical Package as posted on the Section's website (www.skateabnwnun.ca) for details regarding skating up, technical requirements & entry/qualification restrictions.
17. **COACH ACCREDITATION:** All coaches must be minimally NCCP Primary STARSkate Certified and carry their Photo ID card indicating current membership within the Association and a valid First Aid certificate. Coaches may expect to register at the registration desk.
18. **WARM UP TIMES:** Skate Canada has standardized warm up times for all events. Refer to the 2016-2017 Alberta-NWT/Nunavut General Technical Package as posted on the Section's website (www.skateabnwnun.ca) for all warm up times.
19. **SKATING UP:** Skating up one level is allowed. However, competitors must register in **only one** level of the same category (ie, one freeski etc). When skating up program must meet the criteria for the higher level.
20. **AWARDS:** It is the responsibility of any skater receiving a medal to wear their skates and skating attire for the medal presentation.
21. **PICTURES & VIDEOS:** Persons wishing to take photographs of on ice performances are reminded that use of flash cameras is forbidden. The use of video cameras must be restricted to areas that do not hamper the skaters or officials. **NOTE:** You may only take pictures or videos of your own skater.
22. **PROTEST POLICY:** Skate Canada Protest Policy for competitions using CPC will be followed. RULE 7301 (6) (4). In addition, if there is an event using manual calculation where the results are not posted within one hour of the completion of the last event of the day, the protest must be made to the Event Referee within the first hour of the following day's competition. If the Event Referee is unavailable, the protest may be made to the Technical Representative or Chief Referee.

REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS:

REGISTRATION CHANGES: After the registration deadline date, changes to entries will only be made by the Technical Representative. Confirm which event to register in with your coach before submitting your registration.

PROOF OF AGE: For all categories, age shall be the age of the skater before **July 1, 2016**. You do not have to submit your proof of age document when registering. Please bring the skater's birth certificate to the competition so that it may be produced upon request. If you cannot produce proof of age when requested, the skater may be withdrawn from the event. It is your responsibility to ensure the skater is entered in the correct category according to Skate Canada's age and test requirements.

PLANNED PROGRAM SHEETS: Planned Program Sheets are required for STAR 5 – STAR 10 and Gold Freeskate and all Competitive events. Planned Program Sheets must be submitted by **12:00pm (noon) MST on April 14, 2017**. There will be a \$20 fee for failing to register Planned Program Sheets by the deadline. Skaters will not be permitted to register at the competition until the late fee has been paid and a Planned Program Sheet has been completed. **Note: An example of how to complete a Planned Program Sheet can be found on the Section website (<http://skateabnwnun.ca/events/how-to-run-a-competition/>).**
